

PRINCIPALS CORNER

Dear Trojans,

The school year is off to a great start! Students have adjusted well to the new start time and release time. We appreciate this smooth transition. An item to note is the new chronic absenteeism laws. SF 2435 also made changes to lowa Code 299. This is a law for lowa Code 299. In addition to changes in how the schools deal with truancy issues, SF 2435 also made changes to lowa Code 299 that are required to give the County Attorney notice and the parent/guardian notice when a child becomes chronically absent (>10%). The Code requires this notice be sent to the parent/guardian by certified mail. The grading period is a semester. This is mandatory for the school district to follow.

1. School Engagement Meeting. When the school holds the engagement meetings at the 15% absence threshold, the county attorney is also notified.

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The school engagement meeting with a school administrator, the parent/guardian(s), and the student. Ms. Berg will be holding these meetings in her office. A notice will go home to parents via postal mail.

- 2. Truancy Referrals. The school is required to make a truancy referral for prosecution to my office in the event of any one of the following:
- a. The parent/guardian fails to follow the terms of an absenteeism prevention plan entered into at the school engagement meeting; or
- b. The parent/guardian refuses to participate in a school engagement meeting (please make sure we can prove the parent/guardian had notice of the meeting via certified mail or some other acknowledgment to school staff); or


c. The child is truant (>20%). At this time, the county attorney may prosecute the parents/guardians.

Other news: Students are off to a great start with the school year. Fastbridge assessments were completed and students were placed into intervention groups. If your child is not at benchmark and is persistently at-risk, you will be receiving a Model Intervention Plan for your child for reading. This is to inform you of the intervention your child will be given during the school day and any changes to the intervention plan throughout the year. If your child is at benchmark or above, you will not be receiving a Model Intervention Plan.



REMEMBERING 9/11

The 24-25 Tri-County School Student Counsel hosted Musco Lightings, 911 Remembered presented by Gary Gordon on 9/11/24. The secondary students, staff and community members were in attendance.

The day of 9/11/01, Musco Lighting realized they had a product that could help assist the first responders at Ground Zero. Four Musco trucks in Rhode Island and one in New York rerouted that day for Ground Zero. At 11:00 pm on 9/12/01 their lights were operational. Forty-one Musco team members spent 20,000 hours manning five trucks there over the next 247 days. They also sent two Musco light trucks to assist at the Pentagon from 9/13/01 through 9/19/01; one truck to the Pennsylvania Memorial on 9/24/01 and installed temporary light poles in the New York Landfill from 10/23/01 through 06/26/02. The light poles were used to assist those sifting through the Ground Zero rubble that had been sent their way.

Musco had an American flag displayed in a case at the presentation. This was the 1st flag that was flown, hoisted by a Musco Lighting truck at Ground Zero. Mr. Gordon let us know that many flags had been hoisted by the trucks during the duration of their stay.

This event was unlike anything the American people were prepared for. Mr. Gordon explained that it was initially quite difficult for the trucks to get into Ground Zero to assist and over the duration they made many new contacts. Today Musco Lighting has contact with 2-3 different agencies, mostly lead by FEMA, to assist in other major events around the U.S. Now Musco Lighting is able to be of assistance at major weather events and aid in rescues and/or clean up efforts.

Tri-County Schools appreciated Musco Lighting and Gary Gordon for giving this presentation. Thank you to Patty Davis and the student council for arranging this. Thank you to What Cheer Volunteer Fire Dept and Keokuk County Sheriffs Dept. for also being apart of this event and sharing your experience

and knowledge.
